Take a look around and learn all about the nature in the Biosphere Reserve. We have lots of information for tourists and visitors, hiking maps, bikes for hire and great organic coffee.

Our modern exhibition is packed with interesting facts and information about the UNESCO Schaalsee Biosphere Reserve. In changing termporary exhibitions local artists can present their work.

Every first Sunday in the months from April to November, the area just in front of the PAHLHUUS hosts the Schaalsee Biosphere market, where you can purchase locally produced goods.

The Fen Discovery Trail – part of a fascinating Natura 2000 site – starts just behind the PAHLHUUS. From here, you can join the rangers from the Biosphere Reserve Office on an excursion.

How to find us:

The PAHLHUUS is located in Zarrentin am Schaalsee. From Hamburg and Berlin it is easy to access via the A24 (Exit Zarrentin), from Boizenburg via B195 and from Wittenburg via L04. Follow the signs for PAHLHUUS. There is ample parking space available (charges apply). You can also travel to the PAHLHUUS via public transport; further information is available on the websites of the transport providers, such as www.bahn.de.


